Registration

Newly constructed and other water wells are typically required by law to be registered with the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, Office of Conservation ("Department"), within certain time periods following construction completion. Additionally, the Department encourages owners of older, reworked wells and / or un-registered water wells, which were constructed prior to November 1, 1985, to contact the agency regarding well registration.
